He will never have another birthday, or play another footy game, or finish studying health science and physiotherapy under the scholarship he was awarded.


Pat went out on Saturday, April 16, 2016 for a few quiet drinks with mates after playing his first senior football match alongside his big brother.


He wasn't a fighter – it just wasn't his scene. But when a brawl started to build outside the pub - being a loyal and caring mate - Pat stepped in to pull a friend away.

It was then that Pat was punched in the head from behind.

He stayed on his feet, checking all his mates were OK. Soon after however he started to develop symptoms, had a seizure and was taken to hospital unconscious.

Two days later his family made the agonising decision to turn off his life support. Pat's death has left a gaping hole in their lives and devastated his friends and the broader community.

A message from the Cronin family

It seems like every year is our 'best ever', as we continue to reach new milestones and expand our impact.

The 2023-2024 financial year however was truly transformational for the Foundation, as detailed in our 2024 Impact Report – a sister document to this one.

From launching the Act Kindly Activity Kit and expanding our evidence-based Be Wise Education Program to children as young as five, we took bold steps towards building kinder and safer communities.

Our Pat Cronin Foundation Round enjoyed unprecedented community support, bringing together 50,000 players and a crowd of friends and supporters that could have easily packed the MCG to the rafters.

And in March, we shared one of most intimate projects yet. Our powerful new documentary, From the Foundation Up, offered a powerful reflection on our journey in the wake of Pat's tragic death.

2024 also marked the launch of our largest fundraising partnership yet—the Retreat Caravans Raffle.

This exciting new initiative represents a significant step forward in securing the Foundation's future, with plans afoot for similar projects in 2025.

Amid these achievements, the year also carried a deeply personal milestone - Matt's 60th birthday in May.

A reminder that growing older is a privilege, this moment underscored why our mission matters.

Every life touched by our work is another step towards a world where no family has to endure the heartbreak of losing a loved one to senseless violence.

With a quarter of a million young Australians having now attended our signature Violence is Never OK presentation, we continue to honour Pat and create a safer future built on kindness and respect.

As always, we remain steadfast in our mission to End The Coward Punch.
